

Presentation of the Herman T. Pott National Inland Waterways Library's Donald T. Wright Award & James Swift Medal

Saturday, December 1st, 2012 6 - 9 PM

Awarded to notable authors and journalists of distinguished river-related literature and art

Earl Swift, 2012 recipient of the Captain Donald T. Wright Award, is a graduate of UMSL's political science program. He also earned his MFA in creative nonfiction from Goucher College in Baltimore. Mr. Swift has written for newspapers in Anchorage, Norfolk, and St. Louis, where he worked at the St. Louis Globe-Democrat. His newest book, The Big Roads, has been extremely well-reviewed and was a New York Times editors' choice. Mr. Swift is receiving the Wright Award for his book Journey on the James: Three Weeks Through the Heart of Virginia, a riveting story combining his 435-mile journey on the river with its interesting and lively history. Earl Swift has been a Fullbright fellow, PEN finalist, and five-time Pulitzer Prize nominee. He is currently a writer-in-residence at the University of Virginia.

Gregory Thorp, 2012 recipient of the James V. Swift Medal, is one of the great photographers of the life, workers and industry of the inland waterways of the United States. Mr. Thorp has had numerous photographs appear in the Waterways Journal, and his book Rivers Run Past is a fascinating look at life and labor aboard the m/v O. Nelson Jones. His book of photography, A Year Of Corn, won special recognition by the AIGA. Mr. Thorp's works can also be seen at the Seamen's Church Institute, at their Paducah, Houston, Oakland and Port Newark centers.


