Professor Ziurys began an academic career as an Assistant Professor of Chemistry Arizona State University, where she served as Assistant and Associate Professor of Chemistry. She moved to the University of Arizona in 1997 where she was promoted to Full Professor in 1999. Her research interests are in the areas of Radio and Millimeter Astronomy, Molecular Astrophysics, Astrochemistry, Interstellar Medium, and Astrobiology. She is the Former Director of the Arizona Radio Observatory which operates the Kitt Peak 12 m Radio Telescope and the Mt. Graham 10 m Submilimeter Telescope, which are utilized to study molecules in space through molecular spectroscopy. Recent awards and accomplishment include the Barbara Mez-Starck Prize in Molecular Spectroscopy (2015), Elizabeth and Keith Hege Galileo Circle Fellow (2011) Fellow of the American Physical Society (2008), National Science Foundation Creativity Award (2001) and the Presidential Young Investigator Award (1990).
