State of Broadband in Missouri

- Missouri Ranks 41st in broadband penetration among all states in the USA.
- ❖ About 20% of the State's population cannot connect to broadband Internet.
- ❖ This translates to ~1.26 million Missourians not having access to healthcare appointments, virtual education, electronic transactions, telecommuting and connecting with family during the ongoing Covid-19 pandemic.

- This initiative began in 2019 to support efforts to provide high-speed Internet to all Missourians
- ❖ A Broadband Leadership Team was formed to advance UM System's role in improving broadband access
- The team first focused on Bollinger County where less than 2% of 12000 residents have broadband connections! Watch this video to see what it means to them
- Covid-19 has raised the sense of urgency for this project
