Added two upper-level music history courses to the description (MHLT 4000-4280). The Music Department's "Core Curriculum" (classes that all of our music majors must take used to require one such class, and this degree area specified one additional upper-level music history class. But we are proposing a revision to the core which would remove that requirement. degree area, however, still *does* need two of these classes, so we are changing the language here to cover for the removal of one of these classes from the core. The description of the core curriculum already specifies that all music majors must perform a senior recital, and that all students in the Performance emphasis area must perform a senior recital AND a junior recital. The senior recital is in the core curriculum, but the class AP MUS 3500 (Junior Recital, 0 credits) was never added into this degree's program of study.
