Grade Requirement

Professional Education courses must be completed with a grade point average of 2.5 and no of grade lower than a C of C or better (courses completed with a grade of C- or below must be retaken).

GPA Requirement

Beginning with those students graduating in May, 2017 and receiving who will also receive teaching certification, the Missouri Department of Elementary and Secondary Education requires a 3.0 GPA in professional education courses, a 3.0 GPA in the teaching content field, and a 2.75 overall GPA.

Assessment Requirement

Students must pass the relevant exit test required DESE certification assessments to receive the B.S.Ed. degree.
