We intend to retain the minor, but given the fact that we now have the faculty capacity necessary to expand this into a regular certificate program, we will add the option of a “capstone requirement” (special readings, independent study, or internship directly linked to leadership experience in local, state or national settings). Such a program has become all the more necessary given the increasing number of women entering political office across Missouri and the United States. No other unit is able to provide unifying themes and curricular offerings for students concentrating on gender-related politics &amp; policy courses, grounded in social science methodologies. The certificate would require completion of 18 credit hours, drawn primarily from Political Science offerings but also allowing for up to two courses outside the</p>
