Abstract

The purpose of this study was to explore automotive technicians' and automotive technician educators' obstacles and expectations they faced during their educational and occupational endeavors. Constructivism and social constructivism were used as theoretical frameworks. Autoethnography was the selected qualitative research method. Using an interpretive process, they identified the convergent topics of professional obstacles, challenging normalcies, the drive for professional certification, educational policy, a conflicting technical accreditation model, bridging the gap between industry and education and experiential learning's impact on technician competency, to name a few. This research provides effective methods for overcoming the barriers we experience.
