McDonnell Foundation awards UMSL \$8 million to help grow new School of Engineering

The University of Missouri–St. Louis is building a new School of Engineering as it continues to address the high demand for trained engineers across the St. Louis region and the state of Missouri. Those efforts have received a significant boost with an \$8 million grant from the James S. McDonnell Foundation, one of the largest one-time philanthropic gifts in the history of the university.

As UMSL welcomes its first cohort of engineering students next fall, this funding will provide crucial financial support for new high-caliber faculty to teach and to engage with St. Louis industry, in addition to support staff and student success resources. This gift will ensure that curriculum and learning opportunities align with industry needs so students gain the tools necessary for professional success. The grant funds immediate and endowed scholarships that will support students over the school's first five years and for decades into the future, training students for in-demand careers with high earning potential. UMSL's pre-collegiate Bridge-Program will receive a \$1 million endowment to support STEM college readiness programs to prepare students for engineering degrees.

"We are so grateful for the generous support of the James S. McDonell Foundation as we work together to strengthen the future of St. Louis," Chancellor Kristin Sobolik said. "This is truly a historic moment. UMSL shares the foundation's vision for a thriving region where inclusive growth helps lead to shared prosperity and enhances the quality of life for all of its citizens. We believe ensuring our workforce has the skilled engineering talent it needs is critical to its long-term success and vitality."

Bringing more banking to north St. Louis County is more than opening a new branch

On a sunny September morning last year, hundreds of people gathered in the parking lot of a strip mall that sat vacant for years. The crowd was eager for the official opening of the R&R Marketplace, which finally filled the space with a host of services designed to boost economic access in and around the small north St. Louis County municipality. One of those was a new branch from Midwest BankCentre. At the time, bank Chairman and CEO Orvin Kimbrough noted the financial landscape his organization had chosen to move into. There were dozens of payday loan establishments within five miles, he said. "There's one right there within eyesight of me," Kimbrough said, gesturing from the podium he was speaking from. "One of our objectives of opening up this facility ... we want to put them out of business."

Cheers erupted from the crowd at that declaration. But more than a year later, Kimbrough admits those payday lending facilities haven't been easy to disrupt because, while predatory, they do serve a specific need within a market. "You can't talk about displacing those facilities without replacing [them] with something that would meet that particular need," he said. "It's

very difficult for traditional financial institutions, like banks, to compete in that space and be profitable." ... The new Midwest BankCentre branch in Dellwood, which Kimbrough said is the bank's "innovation center," is a prime location for experimentation to determine how to forge stronger ties with communities in St. Louis or elsewhere that haven't always had strong relationships with banks. In addition to Midwest BankCentre's branch in Dellwood, the Urban League of Metropolitan St. Louis announced this summer it will include a bank in a new \$10 million business plaza that broke ground on West Florissant Avenue in August. Representation Matters! UMSL forum for community dialogue focuses on representation in government

Early in December, about two dozen community members and UMSL faculty, staff and students came together to discuss people's thoughts on how they are represented in government institutions. UMSL Political Science professors Dr. Anita Manion and Dr. David Kimball set the context for the conversation with findings from their Boards and Commissions research at this event titled, "Representation Matters: Of the People, For the People." Attendees had an opportunity to ask questions about the research followed by small group discussion. "I found it gave me much food for thought" and "I wanted to continue the discussion," stated one of the attendees. Another noted that "We must provide equitable opportunities and access for all to serve" as a key takeaway from the event.

This was the third in a series of community dialogues at UMSL providing participants an opportunity to make new connections and build their civic muscle through interaction and conversation on political or controversial topics through a deliberative dialogue approach. UMSL faculty member Lara Zwarun shared, "I was very pleased to see a forum in action—what a great idea to bring active, informed community members to UMSL to share and learn and compare notes with each other and with faculty and staff. For those unsure what to expect, it was a nice balance of presentation and active participation, prompted/structured facilitation and 'open mic.' I thought it was very powerful!"
