May is Mental Health Awareness Month, and discussions surrounding mental health have become a national conversation, particularly since the pandemic. According to the National Institutes of Health, anxiety, depression and substance abuse have increased since the beginning of the global health crisis. Therefore, the need for mental health counseling has been in high demand. That demand has largely been unmet in underserved areas.

The city of Ferguson and its surrounding areas including Berkeley, Bridgeton, Jennings and North St. Louis city have been designated by the Health Resources and Services Administration as a mental health provider shortage area.... Normandy Early Childhood Center a benchmark of success

Considering men only represent 2.5% of preschool and kindergarten teachers and 21.5% of elementary and middle school teachers in America, an email to the St. Louis American praising the accomplishments of two Black educators at Normandy Early Learning Center deserved attention and follow-up. LeDominique Rhodes, who described herself as "a parent within the Normandy Schools Collaborative for over a decade," wrote to say she witnessed "firsthand the remarkable transformation taking place at the Normandy Early Childhood Center." Rhodes highlighted "the leadership" of the school's principal and assistant principal, Dr. Lanor Payne, and Aman Lado respectively for the center's remarkable success and improvements in its "culture, climate, and academic performance."

"In the face of numerous challenges, the Normandy Early Learning Center has undergone a truly inspiring transformation under their visionary leadership," Rhodes said. "Their campus has the highest student and staff attendance in the district, the largest academic achievement gains and 100% certified staff. At the beginning of the school year, only 9% of kindergartners were reading [at] grade level. Now, an impressive 65% are reading on or above grade level." <u>Read more</u>.



U.S. News & World Report recognizes the strength of UMSL graduate programs in social work, education, business and public affairs in its 2024 "Best Graduate Schools" rankings

UMSL saw gains in each category with social work, education, business, and public affairs programs ranked among the top 125 nationally. The MSW program climbed to No. 67 nationally in the latest rankings, up 12 spots from when U.S. News last ranked graduate social work programs in 2022. The College of Education's MEd program continues to rank first in St. Louis and third in the state and also moved up 13 places from last year to rank No. 99 nationally. The part-time MBA program climbed 10 places from last year and has now risen 48 places in the past two years to rank No. 115 in the country. Further, the Master of Public Policy Administration Program moved up 13 places to No. 124 nationally and remained the top-ranked program in the St. Louis region. <u>Read more</u>.



EPA Region 7 Partners with Jennings, MO to Redevelop West Florissant Business Corridor

The U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) has

announced that 10 communities will receive technical assistance through the Building Blocks for Sustainable Communities Program. EPA and these local communities will pursue development strategies that expand upon existing Brownfields efforts to advance clean air, clean water, equitable development, and other local goals.

Jennings, Missouri, a city of 13,000 in the St. Louis metropolitan area, is one of the communities selected to receive technical assistance through the Building Blocks program. During the roughly eight months of the technical assistance project, EPA staff and EPA-hired consultants will work with the community to develop a process and identify next steps for the community to achieve its goals.... "Residents often share their memories of what that corridor once was – a pillar of the community, and a place where residents could get everything they needed," said Jennings Economic Development Coordinator Anni Dineen. "This opportunity will equip us to restore the thriving aspects of the corridor in an equitable and sustainable way." <u>Read more</u>.



Gov. Mike Parson tours UMSL's new Geospatial Advanced Technology Lab

Missouri Governor Mike Parson and his wife, First Lady Teresa Parson, visited the University of Missouri–St. Louis campus and took a tour of the newly renovated <u>Geospatial Advanced</u> <u>Technology Lab</u>. Spot, the robot dog, was waiting to greet them as they arrived, and Chancellor Kristin Sobolik and Geospatial Collaborative Director Reda Amer showed them around the space on the fourth floor of Benton Hall.

The Parsons dropped in to observe a class of students working in the GIS lab – which is equipped with 24 workstations featuring the latest geographic information systems software – and also stepped next door into the virtual reality lab. There, Amer pointed out some of the technology tools on hand, including an interactive table, VR headsets and a drone that can be deployed to gather geospatial data. "It's great to be here, and it's great to see all the new stuff and the renovations you're doing," Parson said as he spoke to a room filled with UMSL administrators and members of the Chancellor's Council in the virtual reality lab. "It's all been first-class."

The state-of-the-art facility was built with the help of \$1.1 million in funding from the <u>MoExcels Workforce Initiative</u>, one of Parson's signature programs that he's championed during his tenure as governor. "UMSL is absolutely grateful to Governor Parson for his continued support of higher education at the University of Missouri–St. Louis and across the entire University of Missouri System and the state," Sobolik said during her remarks. <u>Read more</u>.
