University of Missouri–St. Louis remains a leader supporting social mobility in latest US News 'Best Colleges' rankings

For more than 60 years, the University of Missouri–St. Louis has served as an institution of opportunity, providing students from different backgrounds the chance to brighten their futures and lift their socioeconomic status by earning a college degree. <u>U.S. News & World Report</u> once again recognized UMSL for its success in that important role. The publication ranked the university first in Missouri and No. 92 nationally on its list of "<u>Top Performers on Social Mobility</u>" in its 2025 "Best Colleges" rankings.

The "Top Performers on Social Mobility" rankings highlight how well universities have graduated students who receive federal Pell Grants. UMSL has made the list every year since it debuted in 2020, and it has been first in the state each of the past three years.... UMSL continues to provide all students a high-quality education with strong programs in a wide array of academic disciplines. It remained a Tier 1 research university in U.S. News & World Report's overall rankings and also climbed six places to No. 135 on the list of top public universities. According to the Children's Bureau at the Administration for Children and Families, a division of the United States Department of Health and Human Services, over 50% of foster children will have an encounter with the juvenile legal system through arrest, conviction or detention by the age of 17. The Core Collective at Saint Vincent aims to disrupt this pattern and provide services to stop the foster care-to-prison pipeline... The Core Collective is a multi-agency resource that combines services from the St. Louis County Juvenile Office, St. Louis County Children Services Fund, Normandy Schools Collaborative, North County Police Cooperative and additional agencies housed in one location.

Trunk-or-Treat is a Tiny Tritons service event for young children of UMSL families and the surrounding community. A safe and fun way for families to enjoy Halloween festivities, innovative research to strengthen pharmaceutical development and supply chain resilience in the United States. It has partnered in those efforts with the University of Missouri-St. Louis and pharmaceutical manufacturers and suppliers of key starting materials, or KSMs, that form the initial chemical building blocks for synthesis processes.

Recently, APIIC announced it had been awarded \$14 million in federal funding from the Department of Health and Human Services through the Administration for Strategic Preparedness and Response's Center for Industrial Base Management and Supply Chain to lead the development and domestic production of three critical APIs used in the treatment of asthma, diabetes and anxiety disorders. APIIC is investing an additional \$2.4 million in the development of those ingredients. UMSL will play an important role in that work alongside partners....The university has strong research programs in chemical organic synthesis and advanced pharmaceutical manufacturing methods, including continuous flow technologies, and it also boasts strong industry partnerships. Bellerive Bird Sanctuary- a Beautiful Space Getting Some Needed TLC

It was the perfect morning to be working outside last month as students, faculty and staff members from the University of Missouri—St. Louis Pierre Laclede Honors College, Biology Department, and the Office of Sustainability, among others. worked to remove invasive honeysuckle at the Bellerive Bird Sanctuary.

Bellerive Acres City Council member Linda Paunicka worked side by side with the students showing them how to identify the invasive plant species. She also led several volunteers on a short tour of the preserve which includes a lovely little waterfall and running stream. She talked about previous efforts to remove invasive wintercreeper, a very aggressive perennial woody vine that climbs on rocks and trees and has spread all over the ground



area displacing native ground cover. The bird sanctuary is a beautiful find nestled next to campus, and the community has a vision for the site. However, there remains a lot of work ahead to remove the invasive plants, and the UMSL team expressed interest in making this outdoor space a part of their regular volunteer activities. Furthermore, Dr. Meghan Humphries in the biology department is working with students to assess the biodiversity at the site.



Toppling the Tower

Earlier this month, participants of the annual UMSL Alumni 5K began their race against the backdrop of crews working to deconstruct the Social Science Building (SSB) Tower—a key milestone in the Transform UMSL initiative. The deconstruction of the SSB Tower is the first step toward an exciting new expansion of the SSB Building. This progress follows months of preparation, including interior clearance and coordination with contractors to secure essential equipment like the crane being used to dismantle the structure. Throughout this process, safety measures have been rigorous, including using industrial outdoor misting fans to control dust. These steps ensure there is no environmental hazard to the community. The Tower is expected to be fully deconstructed and site cleanup and preparation for the new SSB expansion is on schedule for November.
