During her address Chancellor Sobolik stated, "At UMSL, our vision is clear: campus sustainability and innovation for the future...We are committed to supporting our academic community while uplifting north St. Louis County, the broader St. Louis region, Missouri and the world. # SafeHome.org ranks UMSL among nation's safest campuses

The University of Missouri–St. Louis is dedicated to providing an environment where students can succeed and reach their full academic potential. One part of that equation is peace of mind on campus. The university has worked diligently to maintain an outstanding public safety record through various means, including the <a href="UMSL Police Department's CALEA">UMSL Police Department's CALEA</a> accreditation and body-worn cameras and the Rave Guardian mobile app.

Last month, <u>SafeHome.org</u> recognized UMSL's efforts in this arena in its "2024 College Campus Crime Report and Statistics." The organization ranked UMSL as the fifth safest campus in the country with a crime rate of just 0.07 per 1,000 students and a single on-campus crime annually. UMSL Police Department Captain Marisa Smith attributes this success to the department's connection with students, staff and faculty. <u>Read more</u>.

New fly-through rendering video and an economic impact report released

In case you missed it, this summer the Saint Louis Zoo WildCare Park released a new fly-through rendering video and an economic impact report projecting that the project will generate over \$660 million in economic activity across the St. Louis region within the next 10 years. "We are creating a place where endangered and threatened animals can thrive," said Dwight Scott, Dana Brown President & CEO, Saint Louis Zoo. "But this report makes it clear WildCare Park will help the regional economy thrive too."

WildCare Park, a safari park and conservation center under development in north St. Louis County, is expected to open to the public in 2027. The economic impact report totals WildCare Park's estimated operational expenditures, visitor spending both on and off site and the project's larger impact on regional employment and wages, business sales and tax revenue through 2034.
